Eagles look to rebound in home opener vs. Angelo

Angelo State, which got its season under a new head coach off to a rousing start, will be the Chadron State Eagles' Family Day opponent this Saturday at Elliott Field. Kickoff will be at noon after the CSC players and their parents have been introduced. Angelo State played its first game under Will Wagner, who became the Rams' head coach in December, at Western State College in Gunnison, Colo., last Saturday.

Family Day is over the hill

This is the 40th time Chadron State College has celebrated Family Day during a football game and the Eagles have played well during the annual event. In 39 games, the Eagles own an impressive 30-9 record.

Nice to meet you

Saturday's game is the first time both Angelo State and Chadron State have met on the gridiron. The two schools will play again in 2012 - this time in San Angelo, Texas. The last team the Eagles faced from Texas was when they defeated Abilene Christian 76-73 in the second round of the 2007 NCAA Division II Playoffs. Thirteen NCAA records were set in that game.

The next week, Northwest Missouri State ended the Eagles' season. Current Angelo State head coach, Will Wagner, was on that staff. The Bearcats also ended the season for CSC in the 2006 playoffs. Wagner was also on that staff.

Opening with the RMAC

Two games into the season and Angelo State might already be tired of the traveling. The Rams opened their campaign against Western State in Gunnison, Colo., - a trip that is right at 750 miles - and they followed that with a 915-mile jaunt to Chadron. They aren't scheduled to leave Texas the remainder of the regular season.

Chadron State beginning 97th season of football

Chadron State College is celebrating its centennial in 2011 but the Eagles will be in the midst of their 97th season of intercollegiate football this year. The football program began when the college was founded in 1911, but the college didn't field teams during World War I and World War II. The Eagles have an all-time record of 486-333-15.

Since Chadron State head coach Bill O'Boyle took the job in 2005, the Eagles have been solid after losing a game. O'Boyle, who has lost 18 games in his career, has led his team to 11 victories following a defeat.

About Angelo...

Angelo State will look for its second win in the Will Wagner era, as the Rams travel to Nebraska to take on another opponent from the RMAC. The Rams defeated RMAC foe Western State, 35-12, on Sept. 3, to give ASU its first win under Wagner and the first season-opening road victory in six years.

Give a hand for Nathan

Sophomore Nathan Ross had a stellar start to the 2011 season at Mary last week. The "X" wide receiver caught 12 passes for 120 yards. The 12 receptions ties him for the third most in a game in school history. In 2010, Ross had 34 receptions for 455 yards and five touchdowns.

Rumbling 'Dom' the field

Senior Dominic Morris opened the 2011 season the same way he closed out the 2010 one: with a 100-yard game. Morris, who rushed for 803 yards and six touchdowns last season, ran for 140 yards against the University of Mary Thursday in Bismarck, N.D.

Keifer meet Keifer

Chadron State defensive end Keifer Burke will most likely become well acquainted with Angelo State offensive right tackle Keefer Preece during the game Saturday. Burke, a 6-foot-3, 280-pound junior from Brady, Neb., is in the midst of his third season at CSC after redshirting with the University of Nebraska as a true freshman. Preece, a 6-5, 300-pound senior from Hamilton, Texas, has started 13 games during his career.

Filling in admirably

When Chadron State starting quarterback Jonn McLain got knocked out of last Thursday's game with a concussion, backup Brandon Gorsuch heeded the call. The junior signal caller from Rapid City, S.D., shook off an interception on his first career pass at CSC and proceeded to complete 20 of his final 34 passes for 230 yards and two TDs. Since McLain is expected to be back at full health this weekend, Gorsuch will most likely go to No. 2 on the depth chart against Angelo State.

BILL O'BOYLE

Head Coach / Offensive Coordinator / Offensive Line Coach

In his six seasons guiding the program, Bill O'Boyle has led the Eagles to national prominence. His teams posted three-straight undefeated regular seasons and won three Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Championships from 2006-2008. During that stretch the Eagles won a record 28 consecutive RMAC games. The Eagles also advanced into the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals in 2006 and 2007 and the second round in 2008.

Through six seasons, O'Boyle is already the school's second-winningest football coach with a record of 54-18 and a winning percentage of 75.0. His winning percentage is the third highest mark for active coaches in Division II entering the 2011 season.

O'Boyle, who stresses the importance of playing well at home, has an impressive record at Elliott Field. In six years, the Eagles are 29-6. One of those losses occurred in the playoffs.

On the road, O'Boyle has led CSC to a 25-12 record.

Combined with his time as an assistant coach, O'Boyle has been on the CSC sideline for 151 victories, over 30 percent of the school's all-time win total.

O'Boyle, who credits his coaching staff for the majority of CSC's success, received a huge honor in late 2007 when he was named the Liberty Mutual Division II Coach of the Year. He was chosen from a field of over 150 coaches and was featured in a

special that aired on ABC. With the award, O'Boyle received a \$50,000 cash award to support civic and charitable activities, as well as a \$20,000 scholarship donation to the school's alumni association. O'Boyle said he donated a large portion of the \$50,000 to Friends of Pets, a regional organization that finds homes for rescued dogs, as well as placing unwanted pets.

O'Boyle was also one of five finalists for the award in 2008.

In addition to the Liberty Mutual award, O'Boyle has been named the RMAC Coach of the Year three times and the American Football Coaches Association Region 5 Coach of the Year two times. He was also named the Sportex Division II Coach of the Year and Football Gazette National Coach of the Year in 2006. In 2006, O'Boyle was also the first Chadron State coach to be named the Lincoln Journal Star College Coach of the Year.

He has long been recognized as an exceptional offensive line coach, both from a technique and a motivational standpoint. After sharing the design of the offense and the play calling with Smith a couple of years, he took over as the offensive coordinator in 1999. Under his direction, the Eagles switched from the offset I to the spread formation as their basic offense.

The offense has been successful, particularly during his time as head coach. In six seasons, the Eagles have always finished in the top half of the conference for total offense and have averaged over 29 points every season of his tenure.

O'Boyle, 47, is in his second tour of duty with the Eagles. He spent the final three seasons of the 1980s as the offensive line coach, first as a graduate assistant and then as an assistant coach.

In 1990, he returned to his alma mater, Western Illinois University at Macomb, to begin a four-year stint as the Leathernecks' offensive line coach. But in January 1994, he rejoined the coaching staff at Chadron State, and assumed greater responsibilities for the offense.

A native of Des Moines, O'Boyle is a member of a "football family." Three of his five brothers have been or are high school head football coaches and the other two have been junior high head coaches and high school assistants.

During the summers, "OB," as he's known far and wide, has worked at numerous football camps, including the four team camps hosted by Chadron State.
