### Eagles opening season against Mary; fifth time in six years

For the fifth time in six years, the Chadron State College football team will open its season by playing the University of Mary Marauders. Kickoff will be at 6 p.m. (MDT) Thursday in Bismarck, N.D.

The Eagles have outscored Mary 123 to 37 (average score: 30.7 to 9.25) in their previous four meetings, including a 35-3 victory last year in Chadron.

### Chadron State beginning 97th season of football

Chadron State College is celebrating its centennial in 2011 but the Eagles will be in the midst of their 97th season of intercollegiate football this year. The football program began when the college was founded in 1911, but the college didn't field teams during World War I and World War II. In 96 season opening games, the Eagles own a 56-36-4 record.

### Taking one game at a time

Chadron State head coach Bill O'Boyle has been successful in season openers. He lost his first game, a 28-17 setback to Minnesota-Duluth at the onset of the 2005 season, but since then O'Boyle has led the Eagles to five straight victories.

### Chadron State picked fourth in RMAC Preseason Poll

The Chadron State College football team is picked to finish fourth in the 2011 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. Three Chadron State players earned preseason accolades. They are Tim Hiatt, Maverick Churchill and Kevin Lindholm. Hiatt, a senior from Arvada, Colo., is on the preseason offensive team at guard for the third consecutive season. Churchill, a senior from Scottsbluff, Neb., has been a mainstay at defensive tackle. He had 29 tackles and 2.5 sacks in 2010. Lindholm, a junior from Eads, Colo., finished with 57 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss and four sacks in 2010.

### Mary picked ninth in preseason NSIC poll

The 2011 Northern Sun Preseason Football Coaches' Poll projects that the University of Mary will repeat its finish from last season. The Marauders rank ninth in the overall NSIC preseason poll and are selected to finish fourth in the NSIC North.

## Hometown kids proving their worth

A half dozen Chadron natives are being counted on to help the Chadron State College football team have another winning season this fall.

They are quarterback Jonn McLain, inside receivers Jeff Alcorn and Cody Roes, wide receiver Travis Reeves and brothers Mike and Zach Sandstrom, who play in the offensive and defensive lines, respectively.

The six are the latest in a long line of Chadron natives who have helped the Eagles fly high, particularly in recent years.

Nearly two dozen former Chadron High School athletes have been starters on the Chadron State football team during the past four decades, including 15 since 1987 when Brad Smith became the Eagles' football coach and shortly afterwards hired current head coach Bill O'Boyle and defensive coordinator Todd Auer to join his staff. Of course, the CSC coaching staff can't recruit players any closer to home than Chadron. A portion of the college campus is just across the street from the high school and most of the current players grew up attending Chadron State games and serving as ballboys along the CSC sidelines while they were in high school.

## Hello captain

The 2011 captains for Chadron State are senior left guard Tim Hiatt (Arvada, Colo.), sophomore quarterback Jonn McLain (Chadron), senior defensive tackle Maverick Churchill (Scottsbluff), junior linebacker Kevin Lindholm (Eads, Colo.) and senior linebacker James Belville (Valentine, Neb.).

## About the opponent...

Mary lost seven of its first eight games last fall, but won the last three to finish with a 4-7 record. Myron Schulz begins his 13th season as the Marauders' head coach with an 88-42 overall record.

This year's team returns 46 lettermen and 13 starters.

One of Mary's headliners is senior Brady Martin, who has 77 receptions for 919 yards and seven touchdowns during his career. Another receiver, Tyler Steffan, had 43 catches for 660 yards and four TDs last fall.

Inside linebackers Marcus Broome and DeShon Benton, both seniors, were the Marauders' leading tacklers last fall. Broome had 88 tackles and Benton 76. They also combined for 11 tackles behind the line and four interceptions.

Josh Murray, a 5-11, 210-pound senior, joined the team after playing three years at the University of North Dakota. Murray had a banner season in 2008, when he led the Fighting Sioux with 1,146 yards on 188 carries and 12 touchdowns.

# BILL O'BOYLE

Head Coach / Offensive Coordinator / Offensive Line Coach  
 7th Year as Head Coach/20th Year Overall  
 Alma Mater: Western Illinois (1987)



In his six seasons guiding the program, Bill O'Boyle has led the Eagles to national prominence. His teams posted three-straight undefeated regular seasons and won three Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Championships from 2006-2008. During that stretch the Eagles won a record 28 consecutive RMAC games. The Eagles also advanced into the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals in 2006 and 2007 and the second round in 2008.

Through six seasons, O'Boyle is already the school's second-winningest football coach with a record of 54-17 and a winning percentage of 76.1. His winning percentage is the third highest mark for active coaches in Division II entering the 2011 season.

O'Boyle, who stresses the importance of playing well at home, has an impressive record at Elliott Field. In six years, the Eagles are 29-6. One of those losses occurred in the playoffs.

On the road, O'Boyle has led CSC to a 25-11 record.

Combined with his time as an assistant coach, O'Boyle has been on the CSC sideline for 151 victories, over 30 percent of the school's all-time win total.

O'Boyle, who credits his coaching staff for the majority of CSC's success, received a huge honor in late 2007 when he was named the Liberty Mutual Division II Coach of the Year. He was chosen from a field of over 150 coaches and was featured in a

special that aired on ABC. With the award, O'Boyle received a \$50,000 cash award to support civic and charitable activities, as well as a \$20,000 scholarship donation to the school's alumni association. O'Boyle said he donated a large portion of the \$50,000 to Friends of Pets, a regional organization that finds homes for rescued dogs, as well as placing unwanted pets.

O'Boyle was also one of five finalists for the award in 2008.

In addition to the Liberty Mutual award, O'Boyle has been named the RMAC Coach of the Year three times and the American Football Coaches Association Region 5 Coach of the Year two times. He was also named the Sportex Division II Coach of the Year and Football Gazette National Coach of the Year in 2006. In 2006, O'Boyle was also the first Chadron State coach to be named the Lincoln Journal Star College Coach of the Year.

He has long been recognized as an exceptional offensive line coach, both from a technique and a motivational standpoint. After sharing the design of the offense and the play calling with Smith a couple of years, he took over as the offensive coordinator in 1999. Under his direction, the Eagles switched from the offset I to the spread formation as their basic offense.

The offense has been successful, particularly during his time as head coach. In six seasons, the Eagles have always finished in the top half of the conference for total offense and have averaged over 29 points every season of his tenure.

O'Boyle, 47, is in his second tour of duty with the Eagles. He spent the final three seasons of the 1980s as the offensive line coach, first as a graduate assistant and then as an assistant coach.

In 1990, he returned to his alma mater, Western Illinois University at Macomb, to begin a four-year stint as the Leathernecks' offensive line coach. But in January 1994, he rejoined the coaching staff at Chadron State, and assumed greater responsibilities for the offense.

A native of Des Moines, O'Boyle is a member of a "football family." Three of his five brothers have been or are high school head football coaches and the other two have been junior high head coaches and high school assistants.

During the summers, "OB," as he's known far and wide, has worked at numerous football camps, including the four team camps hosted by Chadron State.

## The last time they met ... Chadron State won, 35-3

The Chadron State College football team had just about everything happen during its first game of the 2010 season. Everything, that is, except a punt.

The Eagles cruised to their fifth-straight season-opening win with a 35-3 victory over the University of Mary Saturday at Elliott Field but it wasn't without drama.

Chadron State lost its starting quarterback – senior Garrett Treffer – near the end of the first half with a hip pointer, but the offense didn't miss a beat under the direction of redshirt freshman Jonn McLain and the solid leg of redshirt freshman kicker Michael Ziola, who booted four field goals and added three extra points.

The defense, meanwhile, did its part by creating three turnovers that turned into two scoring drives and limited the Mary offense to just 97 total yards.

"I'm very happy with the game and to open with a win is always nice," CSC head coach Bill O'Boyle said. "A couple unfortunate things happened but we did a nice job of bouncing back. The young guys played well. We were confident in their abilities before coming into the game and they came through."

One of those unfortunate things was a CSC fumble that Mary recovered at the Eagles' 40-yard line in the first quarter. After going 15 yards in seven plays, Tyler Ryan capped it off with a 43-yard field goal.

The Eagles responded by driving 66 yards in nine plays the next time they got the ball. Treffer, who completed eight of 12 passes for 121 yards and a TD in the game, hit Nathan Ross for a 40-yard gain to set up Ziola for a 20-yard field goal.

Chadron State took the lead for good when Treffer found Jeremy Sondrup for a nifty 26-yard touchdown pass late in the second quarter. Treffer didn't come back into the game following that pass.
