Please note that a change in some course offering schedules in Psychology will occur starting in 2010/2011. Thus there may be some differences in course sequencing that will occur. Students should contact their advisor or the department website for the complete four-year rotation to plan their schedules. In most cases there is not a strict required sequencing of courses, however students should make sure to pay particular attention to complete PSYC 238 and PSYC 438 before their senior year so they will be eligible to take PSYC 432.
